Feature	Our Approach	Most Common Approach
Location of Surgery	In-office operatory No additional charges	Hospital or surgery center Significant additional charges
Anesthesia	Local Anesthesia (no additional charges)	IV sedation or general anesthesia (additional charges)
Pre-Operative Testing	Usually not needed	EKG, chest x-ray or other tests could be ordered in addition to blood work Usually requires additional cost
Hardware Used	No	Screws, pins, plates, etc. (additional charges)

Sterile Surgical Tray Fee

Included at no additional charge

Additional fee often charged

Assistant Surgeon

Surgical tech assists doctor (no additional charge)

Additional fee charged (if utilized)

X-rays

Included (taking and interpretation)

Additional cost (taken at hospital/center, interpreted by radiologist)

Incision Size

Minimally invasive, very small incisions (usually 1 stitch)

Much larger incisions requiring multiple sutures/staples

Post-Operative Ambulation


No casts, walkers, etc. Patients walk out in a surgical shoe

Casts, walkers, etc. often used

Post-Operative X-rays


Included for 90 days after surgery

Additional cost for post-operative x-rays
